

**Transfer Station**  
**June 4, 2007**  
**7:00 PM**

Members Present: Chairman David Woodsome, Brigit McCallum, Donald Holden, Karen Banks, Evan Grover, Dennis Abbott, Willis Lord and Committee Secretary, Nancy Roberge. Visiting: Dean Waterhouse and Clint Andrews.

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM. A motion was made to approve the minutes from the May 7<sup>th</sup> meeting and the May 14<sup>th</sup> Workshop. A motion was made by Willis and approved 6-0.

David suggested that the committee break up into 2 subcommittees to talk about Old Home Days and hazardous waste. Clint, Dennis, Karen and Evan were on the hazardous waste sub-committee and David, Brigit, Willis and Don were on the Old Home Days sub-committee.

Several changes were recommended on the Town of Waterboro Solid Waste Disposal & Control Ordinance:

Section II - Remove a. ~~Town of Waterboro Stump Dump Segregation Ordinance adopted September 27, 1988.~~

b. ~~Transfer Station/Stump Dump Policies as adopted by the Waterboro Board of Selectmen effective March 31, 1992~~

Section IV - Change to read: Solid Waste Disposal Standards.

A. All residential household waste shall be delivered to the Waterboro Transfer Station in polyethylene or P.V.C. bags.

All solid waste should have the following commodities separated out when brought to the Waterboro Transfer Station.

Glass

Cans (All steel and aluminum cans shall be separated)

Newspaper, magazines, cardboard, paperboard, books, catalogues, office paper and junk mail.

And the following solid waste categories are prohibited from being put in polyethylene or P.V.C. bags and disposed at the Waterboro Transfer Station.

Metals

Construction debris

Demolition and bulky debris to be land-filled

Trees, brush and limbs

Leaves, grass clippings, sawdust, hay, straw, manure and non-woody plant material.

It was suggested to shorten item C. under Section IV and also rename section IV to: Solid Waste Disposal Standards.

Clint indicated that a lot of construction debris was thrown in black bags in the hopper on Sunday. It was suggested to impose a large fine for disposing of for example, construction debris into the hopper.

Clint brought to the committees attention that it is DEP regulation to have a Hazardous Waste Exclusion Plan and an Operations Manual on site.

A discussion regarding the pros and cons of Onestream, sorting recyclables at the Transfer Station and curbside pickup were discussed.

Clint informed the committee that there are now six Planet Aid bins in Waterboro, four of them are at the Transfer Station. Clint indicated that the plan is to have a bin at all businesses in Waterboro.

The next Transfer Station Meeting will be held June 2<sup>5</sup><sub>th</sub> at 7:00 PM.
