

**Transfer Station Committee**  
**November 3, 2008**  
**7:00 PM**

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM.

Motion to re-appoint David Woodsome as Charmain by Willis and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Karen and approved 8-0.

Phone Line: Dedicated lines costs \$80.00. The Transfer Station does not have a credit card machine. Clint mentioned that there are a lot of requests for credit cards. Dennis or Evan will investigate whether or not the Transfer Station will get a credit card machine.

Nancy spoke about having David Lowe creating an email address for the Transfer Station Committee. She will work with David to have an email address with automated responses and the emails going to Clint and Karen.

Starting November 8<sup>th</sup> is Maine Recycles week. Brigit would like to do something at the Transfer Station on November 8<sup>th</sup>. Brigit to investigate what is available.

Suggestions to Increase Recycling: 1. Punch card system. 2. Hanging a please recycle sign during the Selectmen's meetings. 3. Having an easel or a banner at the Town Hall saying please recycle. 4. Having the businesses in town advertise recycling on their signs again this year especially once we get the new compactor.

Brigit will talk to Pinetree Networks about hanging a banner on Route 5 and she will also talk to Leo Binette regarding a banner donated from Coke or Pepsi. David Woodsome will talk to Nancy Brandt regarding advertising recycling in the lobby at Town Hall.

Clint reported that EcoMaine will be charging the Transfer Station \$20.00 per ton for cardboard and paper. Clint reported in September we got \$2,700.00 from EcoMaine for paper and cardboard.

On December 2, Kevin and Missy from EcoMaine will be at the Waterboro Town Hall at 6:00 PM for a Workshop with the Selectmen.
